## Year 4 - Severn Valley Railway Trip

Further to the letter you received about our WW2 trip to the Severn Valley Railway, we would just like to update you with some further information. As stated in the previous letter, we would like the children to dress up as they did on WW2 day. The organisers have asked, **if possible**, if the children could all also have a replica of a gas mask box. We have attached a few ideas of how to make a gas mask box to this email, along with a template of a gas mask if the children wish to make this too. However, we understand that this may be difficult at such short notice. Today, we will be sending the children home with an identity card and an evacuee label that they do need to fill in and we would like them to attach this to themselves on the day. On an evacuee label, WW2 children used to write their destination (ours will be 'Highley'), date of evacuation, the city they came from, their name, address, date of birth and the school they attend in their home town. As part of the day, the children may have these checked by actors, playing the roles of WW2 ticket officers.

Please remember to send your child in on this day with a packed lunch and an appropriate coat in case of poor weather conditions. The children's lunch will be later than they are used to when they are at school and so, therefore, please could you also ensure that your child has a piece of fruit that they can eat mid-morning.

### Year 4 - Play Parts and Costumes

All of the children who expressed a wish to have a speaking part in the play have now been given a part and scripts have been handed out. Please support your child with learning their words as we hope to start rehearsals from next week. We have also put the associated songs on the website so that the children are able to practise what we have learnt in school at home. We have been reliably informed that some of these songs are also available on YouTube. In the coming weeks, we will be giving suggestions for costume ideas to your children. Any help with sourcing costumes from parents would be greatly appreciated.

## Year 4 Sports Transition at Aston Fields - Wednesday 14th June

Due to this event being cancelled previously, we are hoping that next week's date will go ahead. The children will be walking up to Aston Fields at around 12:45pm. They will need School PE kit, preferably trainers due to being on the field for some events. Please also ensure your child brings a water bottle and an appropriate coat.

## Year 4 Art and DT

In a few weeks' time, the children will be creating collages in Art. Please could you begin to collect any catalogues, newspapers, leaflets etc. that the children may use to create their collage.

### Saturday 9th July - Bromsgrove Carnival - Children's Challenge Fun Run

As part of Bromsgrove Carnival, on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July there will be a Fun Run for children up to the age of 14 in aid of local charities – Primrose Hospice, the Basement Project, Midlands Air Ambulance and Libby Mae's Little Angels. The run has three age groups – Under 8s, 8s to 10s, and 11 to 14s. The Under 8s run one lap (about 800m) and the older children do two (about 1500m). Races start at 4.00pm and are entirely within the safe confines of Sanders Park, Bromsgrove. Everyone who finishes gets a proper medal and a big cheer as they cross the line. Last year, there were almost 200 children taking part. If mums and dads fancy a go too, then there is the annual Timberhonger 10k race, which starts just after the fun run.
