Writing:

- To write simple sentences using finger spaces, a capital letter and full stop.

Maths

Number and place value:

- To estimate count, read, write and compare numbers up to at least 30.
- To compare numbers and say which is more, less, equal to, greater than up to at least 30.
- To count on and back in ones up to at least 30.
- To count in 2s up to 24 with even numbers and supporting doubles (consolidation).
- To count in multiples of 10 in order up to 120 (consolidation).

Calculation - Addition and Subtraction:

- To work out the number 1 more or 1 less up to 30.
- To read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition to 10 (consolidation) and begin to do this to 20.
