Phonics:

*To recognise the phase 3 graphemes: oo (u) ar ur oo or ow oi ear air ure er ow (oa)

*To read and spell the 'Harder to Read and Spell' words: they all are ball tall when what

*To read and spell words using the graphemes taught. E.g. stood, star, mood, popcorn, crown beard, hairbrush. Sure, winter, elbow

*To read and write sentences using the graphemes and 'Harder to Read and Spell' words that have been taught.

<u>Maths:</u>

*Learn to compare numbers 0-10. Use the language of fewer, more, equal.

*Understand the composition of numbers 0-10 e.g. 3+1=4, 2+2=4

*Combine groups of numbers to find a total.

*Understand how to measure length using non-standard units and using a range of vocabulary. E.g. longer than, shorter than, taller than, tallest, shortest

* Talk about time and order and sequence events of their day using language such as: before, after, next, then, morning, afternoon, evening, night time, daytime

Ideas for you to do at home with your child:

*Continue to reinforce the grapheme flashcards sent home. Practise reading and writing words, using the phase 3 graphemes and encourage your child to use the correct handwriting patter.

*Practise number formation, up to at least 10.

*Practise the composition of numbers 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 e.g. 2+3 =5, 4+1=5

*Research information about pirates. Make telescopes, treasure maps, pirate ships and take a photo of their work to share with their class friends.
